Annual Scientific Meeting Hong Kong College of Community Medicine Rules for Abstract Submission

1. Abstracts must be typed on the prescribed A4 size Abstract Form and received by **7 July 2007**.
2. Organise the body of the abstract as follows :
 - state the purpose of the study (preferably one sentence);
 - describe the methods used;
 - summarise the results;
 - state the conclusions reached.
3. Abstracts should not exceed 350 words. Extra words would be edited without further notice. (Paper presentation must not exceed 15 minutes including 5 minutes for discussion).
4. If you use an electric typewriter, use typeface no larger than 10 pitch or smaller than 12 pitch. Use uniform spacing between lines.
If you are using a word processor, use MS Word 7.0 for Chinese Windows 95 (or above), and Arial with Font size 11. You may cut and paste the text block onto the form. No border is required in the soft copy of your abstract.
5. CAPITALIZE entire TITLE. Underline authors' names (see example below). Underlining or capitalising for emphasis in text is not acceptable. Use single line spacing. Do not leave blank lines between paragraphs. Indent each paragraph by three spaces. Do not indent title. Use standard abbreviations. Place special or unusual abbreviations in parentheses after the full term the first time it appears. Use Arabic numerals to indicate numbers, except at the beginning of a sentence.
6. Presenter must register for the Scientific Meeting.
7. Submit the completed Abstract Form and a soft copy to: Secretariat, Annual Scientific Meeting, Room 908, 9/F., HKAMJC Building, 99 Wong Chuk Hang Road, Aberdeen, Hong Kong. The soft copy (in 11 point Arial) can also be sent by e-mail to fanny_hkccm@hkam.org.hk
