


## HONG KONG ACADEMY OF MEDICINE Conference on Medical Errors Registration Form

He is Professor of Anaesthesiology, University of Auckland, Chair of the Quality and Safety Committee of World Federation of Societies of Anaesthetists, and President of the Auckland Medico-Legal Society.

The conference also benefits from Mr. Woody Chang, local expert in medico-legal arena. Dr. Monica Wong will also share her experience about problems in private hospitals. Dr. Libby Lee will enlighten us on matters with the Hospital Authority.
