

Dear Fellows and colleagues,

The Spring season symbolises growth and a hopeful outlook which is befitting at a time when our city is resuming normalcy after 3 years of the COVID-19 pandemic. Apart from the Academy's Pearl Jubilee celebrations, a series of events are being planned for this year to promote the well-being and professional development of healthcare professionals. The Walk and Run Challenge in March, which was one of the Academy's celebratory events, garnered great success with around 250 Fellows, specialist trainees, colleagues and their families participating in some joyful and exciting sporting activities. We encourage everyone to take part in other Academy events and activities in the coming months.

The Academy has been collaborating with local and external partners to advance its mission of promoting excellence in medical education and research. Recent examples include the signing of a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with the China Medical Association, as well as the renewal of MOU with the Korean Academy of Medical Sciences. Following the success of the first-ever Tripartite Medical Education Conference in January, the Academy is pursuing opportunities for collaborations with the two medical schools and the Hospital Authority to organise future events together.

A Strategic Planning Retreat on Education and Training was conducted on 4 March, providing a valuable platform for the Academy Officers, College representatives, and other stakeholders to engage in fruitful discussion, idea exchanges, and explorations of innovative approaches to enhancing the quality of medical education and training. Readers can gain insights into this important event as shared by the Feature Article of Prof. Philip Li in this issue of academyfocus.

The Academy recently sent a <u>letter</u> to the Secretary for Justice seeking his advice and clarification on how the criminal offence of gross negligence manslaughter is being applied in healthcare settings, and subsequently received a <u>response</u> from the Department of Justice (DoJ). We will continue to maintain communication with DoJ to address any additional concerns that we may have.

Lastly, along with the commencement of a new CMECPD cycle this year, we urge all Fellows to register and utilise the eHKAM LMS system, which features improved accessibility and user-friendliness to help Fellows engage more effectively with online learning opportunities.

FEATURE ARTICLE: STRATEGIC PLANNING RETREAT ON EDUCATION AND TRAINING: ADVANCING POSTGRADUATE MEDICAL EDUCATION

When I took up the role as Vice President (Education and Examinations) starting December 2022, one of my immediate goals was to prioritise the engagement of stakeholders. Organising a Strategic Planning Retreat on Education and Training in the Academy can serve as a valuable platform to engage senior Fellows in the Academy and Colleges who have extensive experience in specialist education and training. Along with this, I aimed to devise a roadmap for the Academy's future growth in postgraduate medical education, training, and assessment.

After thorough planning with the President and senior Officials of the Academy, the Strategic Planning Retreat on Education and Training transpired in the sunny afternoon of 4 March 2023, at Run Run Shaw Hall of the Academy Building.


At the start of the Retreat, our President Prof. Gilberto Leung explained to the delegates from the 15 Colleges the objectives of the Retreat being augmenting the quality of medical education. He expressed gratitude for the support of Academy Officers and Dr. Hing-yu So, the Educationist, and acknowledged the Education Committee's roles in administering and regulating the Academy's training and assessment for the past 30 years. The President also highlighted the importance to review and update training methods to keep up with societal advancements. The Academy is committed to ensure Fellows are well-equipped for their roles and is eagerly anticipating the Retreat's position paper and timeline for a novel approach to medical education.

Dr. So and the planning team conducted a pre-Retreat survey for delegates from the 15 Colleges through a recently introduced e-learning platform (LMS) to gather opinions on prominent themes related to postgraduate medical education, which received a high response rate. Following Dr. So's presentation on the survey findings, I also shared my views of how the Academy and the Colleges could benefit from the Retreat. After being divided into four groups to discuss crucial topics including: curriculum development and ongoing review; faculty development and requirements for trainers and examiners; the effectiveness of CME/CPD provision; and maintaining standards and quality assurance of training and assessment, the participants presented their views followed by an open discussion session.

There was enthusiastic feedback during group and open discussions. The relevance of prioritising 'train the trainers' was highlighted in curriculum development and review to improve the quality of medical education. Fair balance between service load and training quality is essential. Faculty development necessitates motivating Fellows to become adept and proactive trainers. The Academy should offer guidance on fostering trainers. Individual Colleges have the flexibility in engaging stakeholders to facilitate the participation of Fellows in training and examination activities. A unified framework and standard should be established to ensure the effectiveness of CME and CPD, reflecting the core competencies and professional standards of specialists. Strategies for upholding standards and ensuring quality training and assessment need to be formulated.

The President, in concluding the Retreat, emphasised the importance of the event and the Academy's dedication to education enhancement and policy alignment. Close collaboration between the Academy and Colleges cannot be overstated. Investment of necessary resources and securing funding and other forms of support from the Government and other organisations would be very beneficial for such development. Successful implementation of these ideas could establish a robust base for the Academy to bolster its roles in the development of specialist training system in Hong Kong, China and around the world.

The afternoon was very enjoyable and fruitful for both myself and the participants, putting us one step forward in advancing the education for our Fellows and trainees.

In our pursuit of a more advanced learning platform, starting from 1 July, the LMS will become the Academy's exclusive system to deliver CMECPD quizzes. Starting from 1 July, all users will be required to submit their CMECPD quizzes solely via LMS.



Renewed Partnership in Simulation-Based Training between the Academy and the Hospital Authority

The Hong Kong Academy of Medicine (HKAM) and the Hospital Authority (HA) have recently renewed their Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) for 2 more years, starting from 10 December 2022 until 9 December 2024. This development strengthens their partnership and facilitates the sharing of valuable knowledge and expertise within the healthcare sector. A key feature of the MOU is the agreement on CMS Virtual Visiting Scholars (CVVS) arrangements, where both parties will jointly support placements. This initiative underscores the commitment of HKAM and HA to promote education and

In addition, HKAM has agreed to continue offering discounted rates for HA employees participating in HKJC ILCM programmes that complement the simulation training provided by HA. This move aims to motivate HA staff to seek further education and training opportunities, fostering their growth and development. The renewal of the MOU between HKAM and HA highlights their dedication to enhancing cooperation, knowledge-sharing, and professional development in the healthcare community, laying a solid foundation for a more prosperous future.
