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*Dear Fellows and colleagues,*

At the time when I wrote this message, the first imported case of Zika virus infection was reported in Hong Kong. Fortunately, the patient was then tested negative for the virus and has been discharged. Hong Kong is facing a high risk of importation of Zika virus due to our high volume of international travel. Not only do doctors have to remain vigilant, so does the community. This case reminded us of the pressing need for emergency preparedness.

The Hong Kong Jockey Club Disaster Preparedness and Response Institute (HKJC DPRI) has been playing an important role in providing training on disaster management and promoting community resilience in Hong Kong since its establishment in 2014. In addition to organising our second Annual Conference on Disaster Preparedness and Response on 8 October, HKJC DPRI has been invited by the World Health Organization (WHO) to host the 2016 WHO Emergency Medical Teams Global Meeting from 28-30 November. More than 300 participants from over 50 countries are expected to gather on this momentous occasion in Hong Kong to share on governance strategies, recent developments, innovations, and good legal, clinical, technical and operational practice in global medical emergency response. I am sure participants will have thought-provoking discussions and it will be a successful meeting.

For more than two decades, the Academy has been standing firm on our commitment to maintaining high standard of specialist training, and promoting continuing medical education (CME) and continuous professional development (CPD). In an effort to facilitate the implementation of our training programmes, some years ago we developed a web-based platform named the International Network for Continuing Medical Education and Continuous Professional Development (iCMECPD). To further enhance the online services for our Fellows, we deem that the Academy has to move with the times. In view of the growing popularity of smartphones, the Academy has created a mobile application, iCMECPD App. Using the App, Fellows can capture attendance, check records, and view the CME/CPD points and the detailed profile of current cycle anytime, anywhere.

The Academy strives for continuous improvement, so we seek to develop better operational procedures to handle accreditation. Thanks to the efforts by the Secretariat staff, the iCMECPD online system has recently been upgraded to process the accreditation and CME/CPD records. Paperless accreditation procedures will greatly enhance the efficiency and effectiveness. We are now liaising with College Secretariats and organisers to prepare for the implementation of this new system, which is expected to start in the 2017-19 cycle. I am certain that our Fellows will support and like this new system and App.

To ensure safe and quality patient care, training through simulation has become one of the essentials in our CME/CPD training. By making use of simulators and simulation techniques, the Hong Kong Jockey Club Innovative Learning Centre for Medicine (HKJC ILCM) provides educational programmes for trainees and specialists on medical knowledge, procedural skills, clinical decision making, and even communication and teamwork. In November, HKJC ILCM will organise the Comprehensive Simulation Educator Course. Participants will learn the basic knowledge and skills to plan and run a simulation-based training course. Through this course, we also hope to cultivate participants' interest and passion in simulation-based education.

During the past few months, I attended various local and overseas scientific meetings on behalf of the Academy, strengthening our international network. In August, I visited Kuala Lumpur with the Officers and Council Members to celebrate the 50th anniversary of the Academy of Medicine of Malaysia, and participated in the Malaysia-Singapore Congress of Medicine and AMM-AMS-HKAM Tripartite Congress. I am glad to report that we have renewed the Memorandum of Understanding with the counterparts in Malaysia and Singapore to maintain our collaborative relationship to host the Tripartite Congress. It will be the Academy's turn to host the next session of the Tripartite Congress in Hong Kong.

The remaining months of the year will be a busy time for the Academy with the conferment of our Colleges. May I wish you a pleasant, peaceful, and productive Autumn.

The Academy Council is of the view that the follow-up actions are able to address Fellows' concerns and we commit to continue dialogue and consultation with Fellows on this matter in future.

## Annual Subscriptions


Demand notes for the 2016 subscriptions have been sent to Fellows in December 2015. Fellows who have not settled their subscription before 30 June should have received a demand note for subscription and surcharge. Please settle as soon as possible.

Reminder:

1. All payments must be received by the Academy before 30 September. According to Bylaw 6.4:  
If a member's fee or any other moneys due by a member to the Academy is not received by the Academy within 9 months after such payment falls due, despite two written reminders by the Academy to pay, the member shall automatically forfeit his membership.
2. It is Council's policy that late subscriptions received by the Academy after 30 June will be subject to a surcharge of 5% on the subscription amount.
3. For Fellows who have authorized payment via bank transfer / credit card, payments will be deducted from their bank accounts or credit card automatically.
4. Fellows aged over 70, or have reached 70 before the beginning of the next subscription year, do not need to pay any subscription and will not receive a debit note.
5. Fellows residing outside Hong Kong or have reached the age of 65 and have retired from all remunerative practice/job/business must submit written applications for reduced rates before 31 December if they wish to enjoy the reduced rates next year. # The iCMECPD App — a “Green” Way to Capture Attendance for CME/CPD by Fellows

To further enhance the online services for Fellows to capture their attendance for CME/CPD in an eco-friendly way, the Academy has developed a mobile application for capturing attendance — **iCMECPD App**. The App is now available at Apple’s App Store and Google Play. HKAM Fellows can use the App to scan the QR code of the event to capture attendance. Fellows’ attendance records will be automatically uploaded to the iCMECPD system and eventually confirmed by organisers. HKAM Fellows can also easily check their attendance records in the App anytime, anywhere. In addition to attendance capture function, the App also allows HKAM Fellows of Colleges that have joined the iCMECPD to view their latest total CME/CPD points and detailed CME/CPD profile of the current cycle.




In addition to the iCMECPD App, the overall accreditation process should also be done online and no more papers should be used at any accredited CME/CPD activity. As the online functions for accreditation application, confirmation of attendance list, and assigning CME/CPD point functions at iCMECPD have been recently completed, organisers and Colleges are encouraged to make use of the iCMECPD system to process CME/CPD records more effectively and efficiently.

Starting 2017-19 cycle, organisers will be required to:

- submit applications to and receive accreditation results from Colleges via iCMECPD;
- download and display QR code posters at the venue;
- remind HKAM Fellows to bring their smartphone to the events;
- use App (Organiser mode) to help capture attendance for HKAM Fellows, if necessary; and
- update and confirm all attendance records at iCMECPD.

The Academy will continue liaising with College Secretariats and organisers in the second half of this year for preparing implementation of this new system.



## CME/CPD Reminder

The current CME/CPD cycle for Academy Fellows will end on 31 December 2016. All Fellows who are on the Specialist Register (SR) of the Medical Council or Dental Council will need to fulfil the requirements of the Academy to remain on the SR. Fellows, except those exempted for CME/CPD due to retirement, are also required to fulfil the requirements to maintain the Academy Fellowship. Fellows are reminded to make sure they will obtain the required number of CME/CPD points before the end of this year, and to catch up if the points they have obtained so far falls behind greatly of the requirements.

## CME/CPD Principles & Guidelines 2017-19

Fellows may wish to note that the CME/CPD Principles & Guidelines for the next cycle 2017 to 2019 will remain unchanged, i.e. no more than 75 points can be awarded for passive participation in a 3-year cycle. Fellows are strongly advised to maintain a balanced CME/CPD profile with a mix of different activities, in order to capture the full benefit of different types of CME/CPD activities.

## Hong Kong Medical Journal

### Opt-in for Hard Copy

Since its inaugural issue in 1995, the *Hong Kong Medical Journal* (HKMJ) has been mailed to all HKAM Fellows as part of their membership benefit. The HKMJ website also provides free full-text archives of all articles, with advanced search features and video room for educational purposes. Last year, the journal website was redesigned and optimised for a variety of screen sizes ranging from smartphones, netbooks and tablets, to laptops and desktop screens; this offers high readability of website content.

Over the last few years, there have been repeated suggestions from Fellows to reduce the number of paper copies of HKMJ. Although the cost of editorial production will not change, the environmental impact will be reduced and financial savings in printing and mailing costs will be large. This suggestion was brought to the HKAM Council for discussion recently and it was resolved that an OPT-IN approach would be adopted.



Fellows who wish to continue to receive their hard copy of HKMJ starting the December 2016 issue will need to 'OPT IN'. They are required to do ONE of the following by **31 October 2016**:

- Log in to the iCMECPD website. Under User's Corner of the main menu, select *Personal Profile*. Check the box under HKMJ for 'Subscription (hardcopy)', or 'Subscription (hardcopy & e-Alert)' if e-Alert service is also wanted. Click SAVE.
- OR
- download the form on the HKMJ ([www.hkmj.org](http://www.hkmj.org)) and HKAM ([www.hkam.org.hk](http://www.hkam.org.hk)) websites and return the completed form to us by mail or fax (852) 2515 9061.

As the HKMJ remains a benefit of membership, Fellows who do not opt in for a hard copy will be automatically enrolled in the e-Alert service and will receive an email with the table of contents when a new issue is available online, starting with the December 2016 issue. The e-Alert service can be cancelled by clicking "Unsubscribe" at the bottom of the email.


